Dear Sirs

Yours of 21st but with a little delay has been received and is now before us. Since we last we have made but three small orders of Cotton wool - 20 bales, 200 bales, good ordinary mixed with a little poor middling at 6th and 7th bales, the last gathering of J & J Trigg's Crop at 4 7/8. The market continues quite stiff, offering small, and receipts small. The advance for the lowest point of depression three weeks ago is 1/8th the latter applicable to good ordinary to poor mixed, which are most in request, the former for all crops.

If the great accounts from Spain should not be worse than the last, and the consumption demand large, prices will improve in a few months after they are received, but the capacity to that place are so exceedingly heavy we have our fears.

Under these circumstances, we feel great anxiety, which cannot be pursued, still we hold.

We wrote you some time since we had advanced to Mr. Wm. H. Pope something like four hundred dollars, more than we estimated his crop in Alabama would fetch counting at 71 bales here and so yet to come down - and that we had told him we would accept his bill payable to Trigg's bill for 600 more. We would much rather he would not draw on us for the latter sum and would be glad you would mention

The heavy rains that have fallen for some weeks past in all the region tributary to this place must cut the crop very short. Mr. Percy writes from Lake Washington he will make only 4500 lbs. in stead of 7000 as he counted on - and remarks that there immediately on the River will not make one half a crop. They write the same way from the District and in the interior of Miss. In South Ala. Georgia & Carolina they seem to have been more fortunate in regard to weather but the crop in the latter state will be a short one. If you can operate at all plants in your region it would be our interest to do so but we fear the expectation of your people has been raised for S. O. Cotton & other under date 21st but that at Tusculum it is worth 7th of an Al. pound. Making cotton just equal to North Alabama's crop through, an acre today 7th of a bushel. If you should think of producing to us and the South in your operation, we have no objection to have the matter with you. It is quite useless for you in any matter of this sort to consult for our advice as long of time is calculated to lose the opportunity of making advantage. We do not calculate to see a crop of very high price, the stock in Europe, the enormous quantity worked up into goods this year, supplying all the markets pretty well - forced out in value, but we have all anticipated to see an extension fully equal to ordinary times, that is to say, the price of cotton for fair equal to of 1842 and should the consumption next year meet with an equal check the stock would get to be too much middle summer and fall as to please the markets in Europe at the mercy of Capitalists, and thus a week of a small market place. 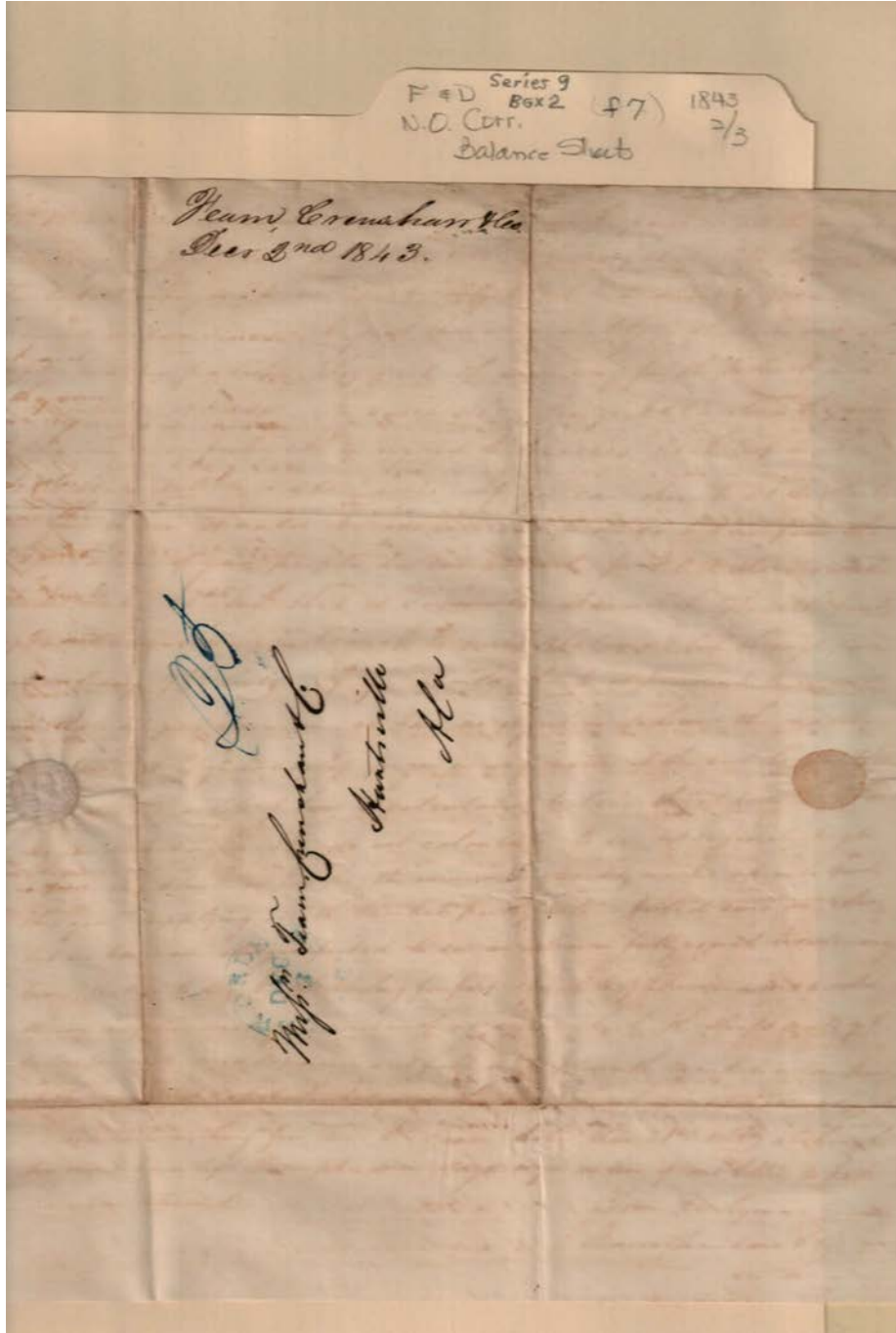

The weather has been ever so finely rainy since we had this that
 by far you and both letters and we hope to see you here in a few
 days. The contemplation is so much to be enjoyed in this time.

The little market has been very quiet since Saturday, but it has
 been every day sanguine - asking prices higher of any thing the last
 number but a few days more of stillness in the market would cause
 an anxiety to sell which might result as it did last week of
 bringing speculators out again. We never have seen such a fair
 disposition to speculate in any thing before and it is by no means
 confined to this place for every town in the upper country seems to be
 infected. There is also great sensitiveness displayed in the accounts and
 rumors from all the large shipping ports as well as in Europe. If nothing
 should occur to check consumption in Europe we shall see a light
 before the first day of May next.

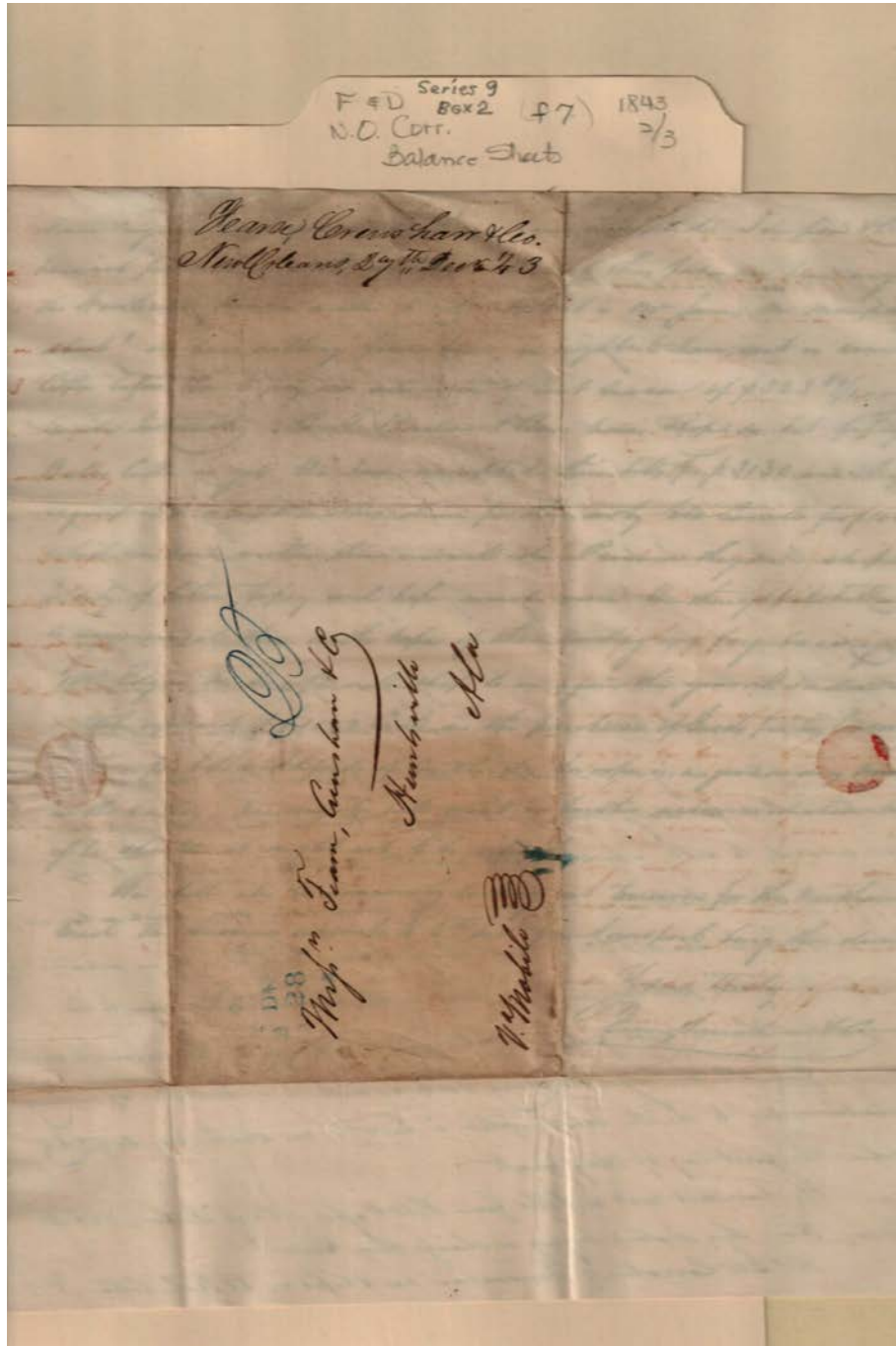

Dear Sirs,

We are without any of your favors since date of 25th ult. and feel serious apprehensions as to the health of our Mr. Donegan. Since our last the Cotton market has continued to stiffen the sales of today about 3000 bales, and to be 1/4 a 1/2 higher price. The English buyers are doing very little yet but New Yorkers are in the market and our house from Philad^a bought 2000 bales in one lot besides small parcels. The accounts for all quarters tributary to this place are now cleared in regard to the great damage done by the continued heavy rains. Some persons have reported their estimates to 1,600,000 & 1,700,000 Bales for the whole crop and we cannot now hold to more of 1,500,000. Middling is now worth 7 3/4¢. Good middling 8¢. Middling fair 8 1/2¢ - fair of good fair 9¢ - Good 10 - Choice 10 1/2¢ & 11 - and yet there are many holders who will not offer their stocks. We are not offering any but such as is advanced upon and then only when we must have money. The fees you may not have been able to do any thing in the way of buying but might safely go to be 6 1/2¢ lots for Common to good crops through.

We trust most sincerely you may be doing a good deal in the way of advancing to draft orders, for Commissions, count beautifully, all present prices and in fact ahead there is yet to be a fair this advance.

The subsequent publication caused a suspension of the operations

 the 4th March onwards from Memphis on, up to that time, the stocks will be diminish-
