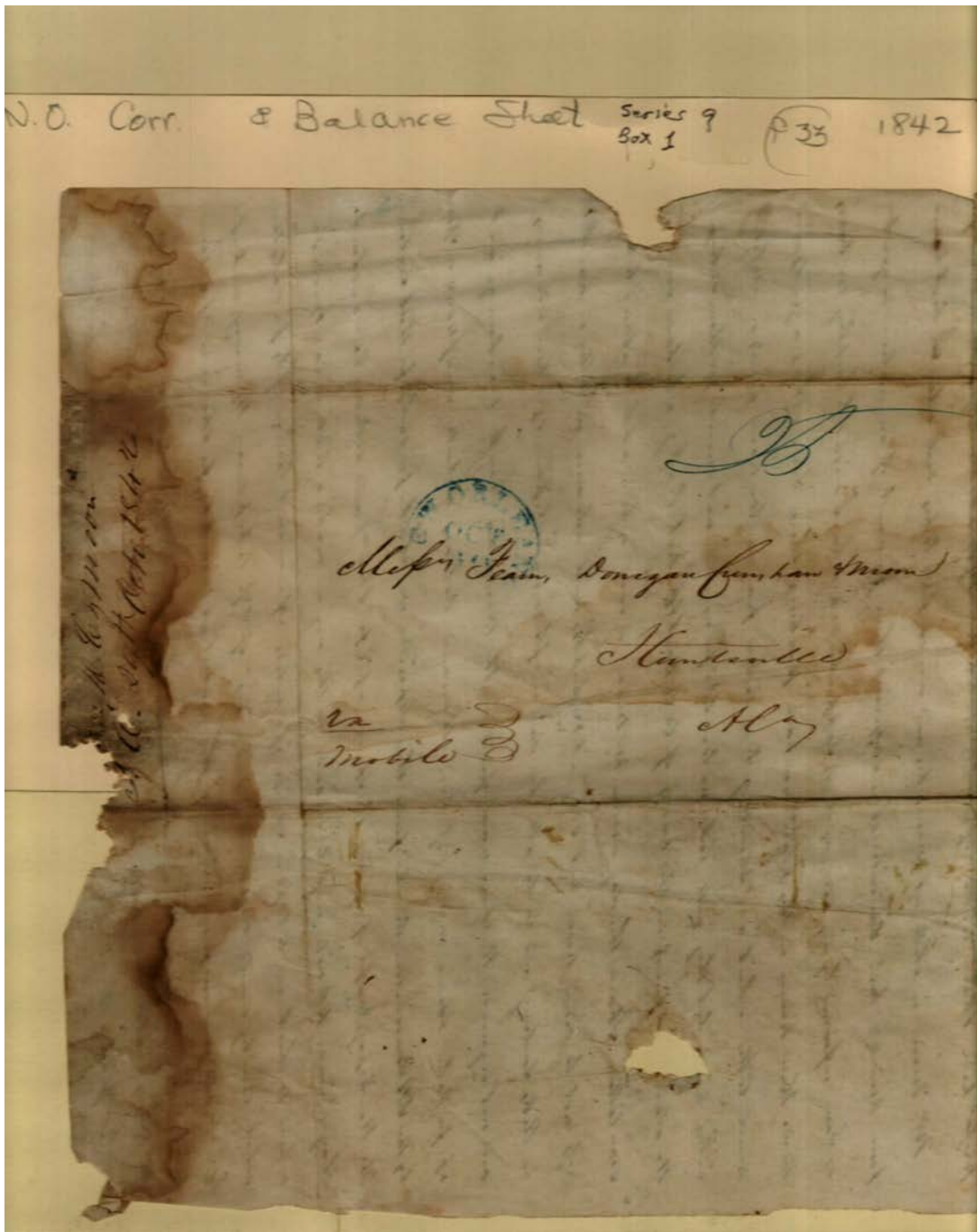

My dear Sir,
 I have your Dear Sir's letter of 19th Inst. before me, rec^d by this day's mail, and note contents. I will send a check for one hundred Dollars to Wm. McDonald at New Orleans as he directs. I am sorry to hear of Mr. Donegan's ill health & confinement, for I have heard prof^d here that with a fortnight's rest my eyes absolutely ache all day. Mr. Moon is still at Memphis and was confined to his bed when we last heard from him 22nd Inst. Our interest is suffering there for want of an active agent as I am informed by my son, and as I apprehend when I wish to employ Mr. Davis there, there being in this place no one who has there & two others a good deal better which we should get is taken from us. We have found in Mr. Davis' hands but they will take no trouble for us, and not mind for themselves. We also have found in the hands of W. W. Hart & Co. but Ricky who have sent us some Cotton. I have this day written Mr. Moon as soon as he is able to attend to his affairs not to come here but stay at Memphis and advance on Cotton in hand on Bills Landing and to be all he can in influencing shipments where and where are not required. We have now found in the Memphis Bank (Exchange and up for sale some money) of seven thousand Dollars whole and 4000 in fine by the Steamers. As the funds thus deposited are subject for sale for that business.

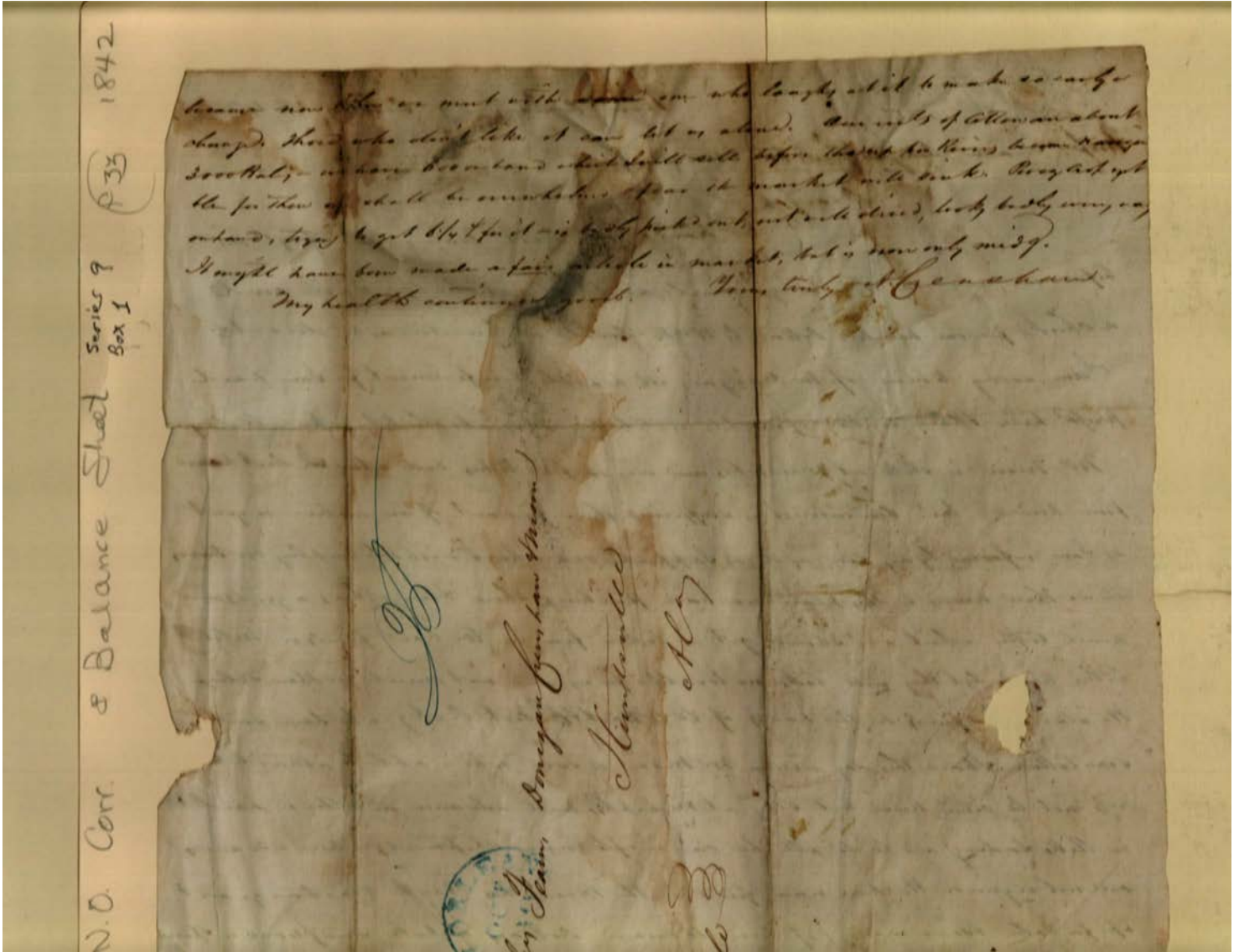

Dear Sir

Some of the 15th inst. was rec^d by
 yesterday's mail. You concerning yourself greatly, agreed
 and approving us all of what you are pleased to consider
 the facts of the case, and us to pay you a balance of five
 dollars. ~~and this we will pay you~~ and shall accede to your
 proposition of submitting the matter to arbitration or to
 the decision of the courts of our Country. We have made
 a careful examination into the circumstances connected
 with this business and will now state them.

The steamer Walth in the Water with your cotton ~~is~~
~~has~~ arrived here on the 25th of May '42. But
 your cotton was not delivered to us until the 1st of
 June - consequently we could not have brought it into
 market earlier than that period - the unfavorable
 from Europe of 4th May which produced the prostration of
 the market was relieved here on the 30th of May - there
 was no demand after that period until the 1st of
 June - ~~when your cotton was delivered to us~~
 what you sold of it at the rate which you were
 of better quality - which were less affected by the decline.
 We will not undertake to say there was not a sale held
 after this time, but we believe there were few if any of the
 quantities below four sold except in lots with other kinds.
 We will not deny the fact stated by you, that two gentlemen
 from the country shipped some 70 or 80 bales on the
 market for several days at 10% or 10% per bale
 and as it is known and admitted that the
 market was not so high as to be 10% or 10% per bale

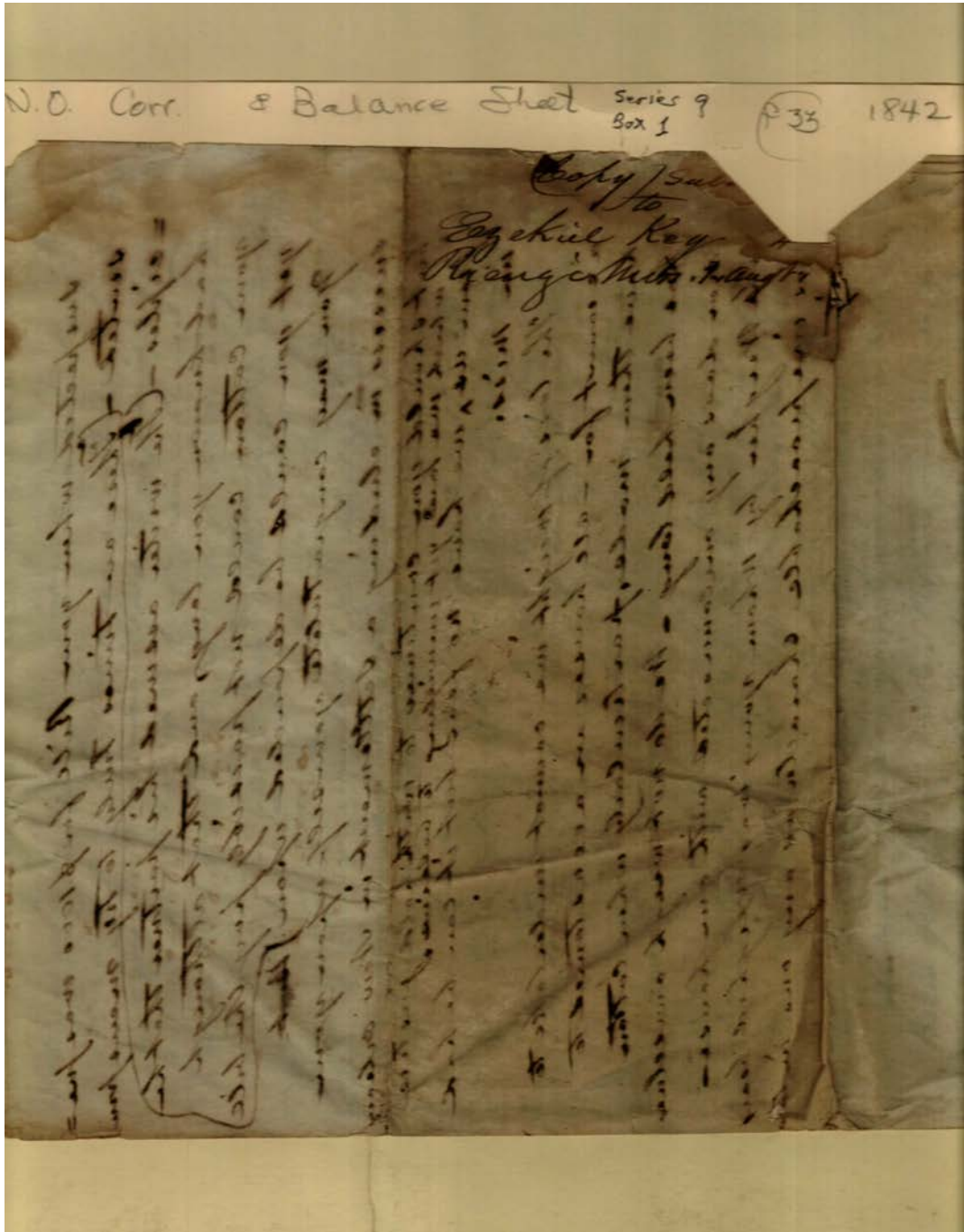

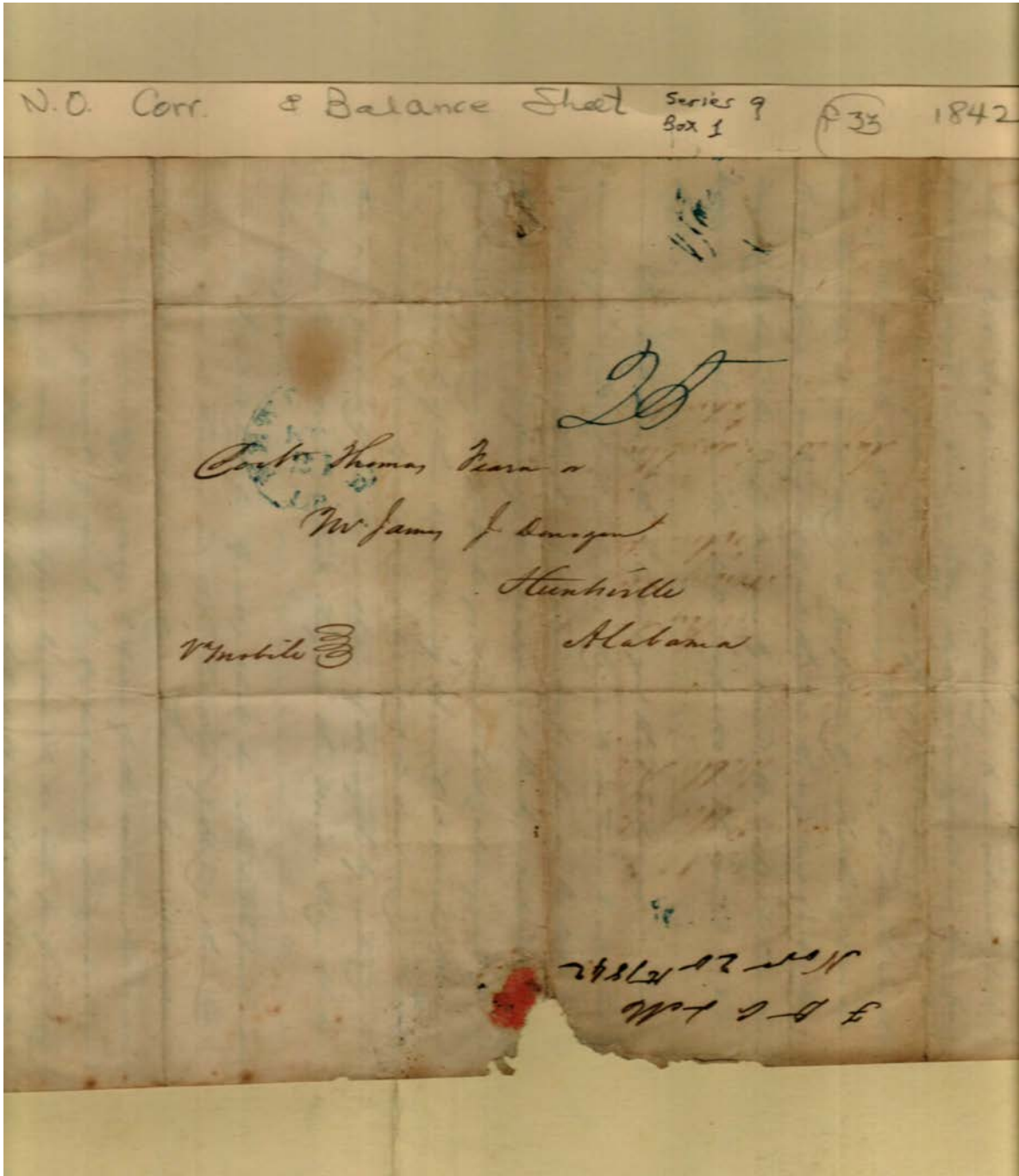

We send yesterday yours of 9th Inst. & thank
 you. We have sent you regularly twice a week the large
 list of the market - on yesterday - I do not know you the true
 state of the market respecting in the reports of actual sales
 by which you will see the average of full quantities, about 6 1/2
 The fact is the market has sunk 1/2 since end of Sept. only
 6 1/2th only - at first 1/2 bit of the large receipts of the week
 became before by investment, and on the 17th instant holders
 could generally be heard come to the conclusion to sell 1/2th until
 so heavy operations on the day - since about the market
 is being very dull and peculiarly so, so a desired to have
 a further concession. We have made no sale since the change
 in the market having set out the day the unfavourable sale
 was not, our receipts have been small since we had an order of
 500 bales in the lobby, 100 of which was sampled yesterday, which
 we expect to be able to sell at 6 1/2 or 6 1/4 - the latter price
 we were willing to accept and the lot is quite as good as could
 be had. We had a consignment on the 17th inst. of 1000
 bales from Ransdell & Co. Pickering, as we are supplied
 by the officers, all of which was turned together with all the property
 of the house. We do not expect to have a difficulty in selling
 with the officers - but must confess a delay in getting the bills of
 Lading returned by the shipper.

We have not had the receipt of a few from Mr. Moore
 since he left here - yet Mr. Mathew Watson who came from Memphis

 when he left. We presumed he is attending to our interests, but
 we really wish he had a better disposition to let us hear from
 him. We have given him all necessary instructions about
 keeping his accounts and if he observes them we his death would
 not lead us in uncertainty or perplexity. The thing is so low
 Brady are long in making up of us there is the regular trade the
 Memphis had been up two months toward. We expect to hear from
 Mr. Moon by the Louisville what is expected in the course of 2 or 3
 days.

I'm well sir by the U.C. don't you think Jackson you are getting
 worried again and it is reported they will continue to decline
 until another avalanche of specie drops upon us. We hope to
 the redemption of four of the suspended banks, which is but a
 few tomorrow, may help exchange somewhat at any rate for a
 while. Some of them have heavy specie deposits of course
 and all have friends who are interested in sustaining them
 they will probably make a show of strength by entering the
 bill market to some extent. They are the Union, City, State
 Commercial.

Your orders for goods shall be attended to particularly
 by all soon as there is an opportunity of shipping them to
 Nashville - indeed we will lay them in tomorrow.

We are exceedingly sorry to hear of the continued indisposi-
 tion and confinement of our L. S. O., but have no disposition
 to urge him to come down before he can do so with perfect safety
 to his health. We get on tolerably well without hiring an
 additional clerk.
