BLONNT COUNTY, Gabriel Henby	
Gabriel Hanby began his contributions to Blount County and Alabama soon after his arrival. He was easily elected a delegate to the Constitutional Convention which met in Huntsville, Ala- bama, July 5, 1819.	
"The Alabama Territory was created by Act of Congress, March 3, 1817. Just two years later, less one day, March 2, 1819, Congress passed an enabling act for the admission of the Terri-	
tory into the Federal Union 'On an equal footing with the Orig- inal States,' Elections for Delegates were held in May, 1818.	
"The Convention met in Huntsville, Alabama, July 5, 1819, There were 44 Delegates, each of the 22 counties having as many delegates as it had members in the Territorial House of Repre-	
sentatives. Madison County had 8 Delegates. The President was	
John W. Walker, later chosen by the Legislature, one of the two, first U. S. Senators from the State. John Campbell was Secretary.	
The Convention adjourned on August 2, 1819, having been in session actually 21 days. In 1910, the Twickenham Town Chapter	
of the Daughters of the American Revolution, at Huntsville	
placed a stone marker on the site of the building in which the convention was held. 'A true and attested copy' of the Constitu-	
tion (later printed as House Ex. Doc. No. 1, vol. 8, pp. 24) was	
transmitted by the enabling act and the Sixteenth Congress.  First Session, promptly passed a resolution 'declaring the admis-	
sion of the State of Alabama into the Union.' President Monroe	
approved the resolution on December 14, 1819, a date now gen- erally known as Alabama Day.
