Chief Justice Brickell makes a very clear decision on this question, in Perkins vs. State, 50 Ala., 155:

"The objection urged to the indictment, that, on its face, it purports to have been found by 'the grand jury of said Court,' instead of said county, cannot be sustained. The caption of an indictment is that entry of record showing when and where the Court is held, who presided as judge, the venire and who were summoned and sworn as grand jurors; and the caption is applicable to, or is a part of, every indictment, and need not be inserted therein. If the caption, or any part thereof, is inserted in the indictment, it may be rejected as surplusage. An indictment commencing 'The Grand Juror for the State of Alabama, upon their oaths present, &c.,' is sufficient, the name of the proper county appearing in the caption. In this case, the caption of the indictment shows the venire and the general organization of the Grand Jury. The Grand Jury, making the presentment, thus appears to have been a Grand Jury empaneled to inquire and present for the county of Barbour; and the allegation 'for said court' will be treated as mere surplusage."

In Pairo vs. State, 49 Ala., 26, the first count in the indictment was the only count which contained the averment "The grand jury of said county charge that, before the finding of this indictment, &c." The first count was quashed, and the defendant demurred to the indictment as being imperfect and bad on its face, in not having the above averment—"The Grand Jury of said County, &c." Judge Peters held that indictments under the Code do not make the caption a part of the Court.

"The caption is a general statement of the name of the State, the county, the Court and the term, in and to which the indictment was found. This statement is applicable to each count in
