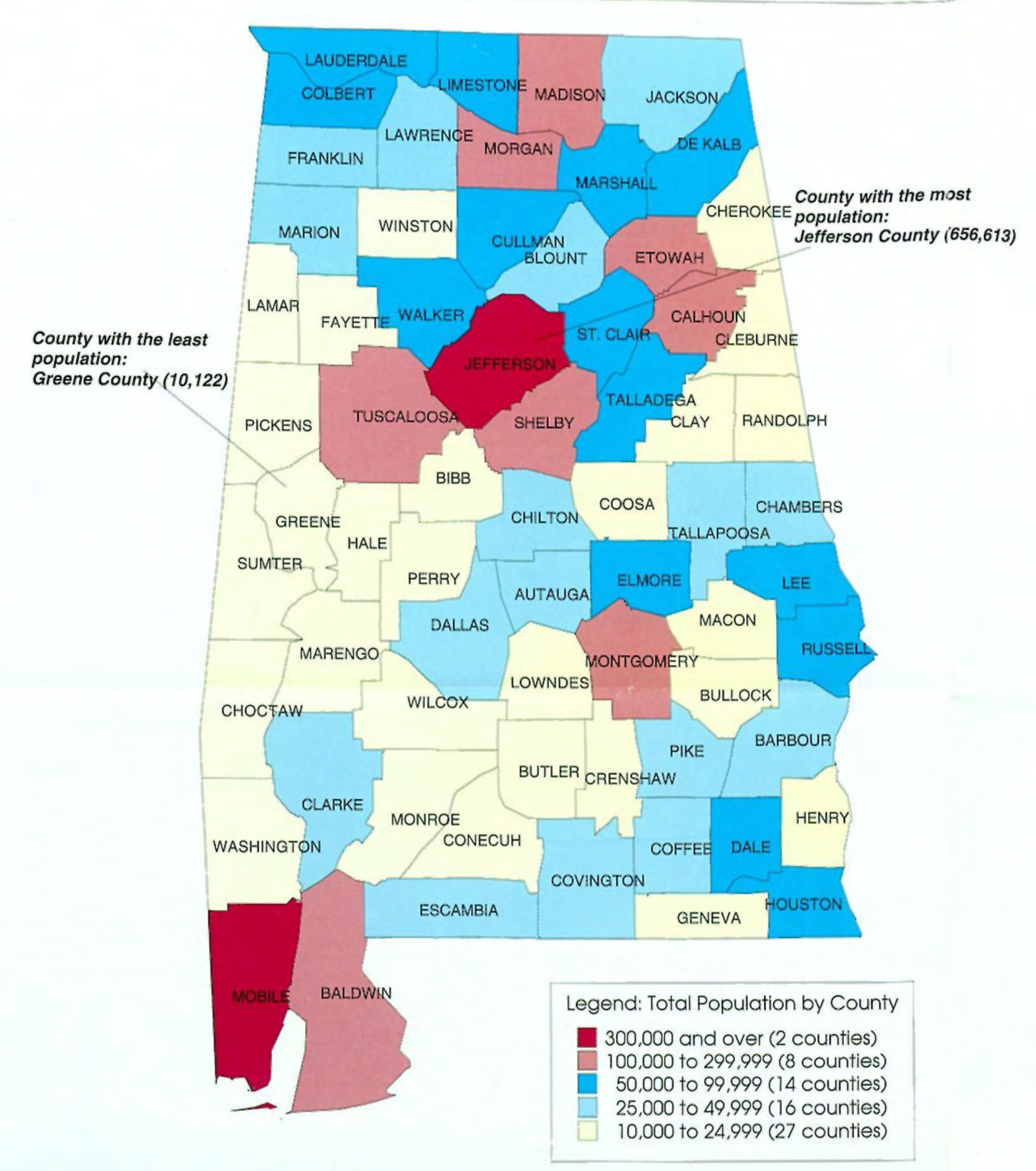

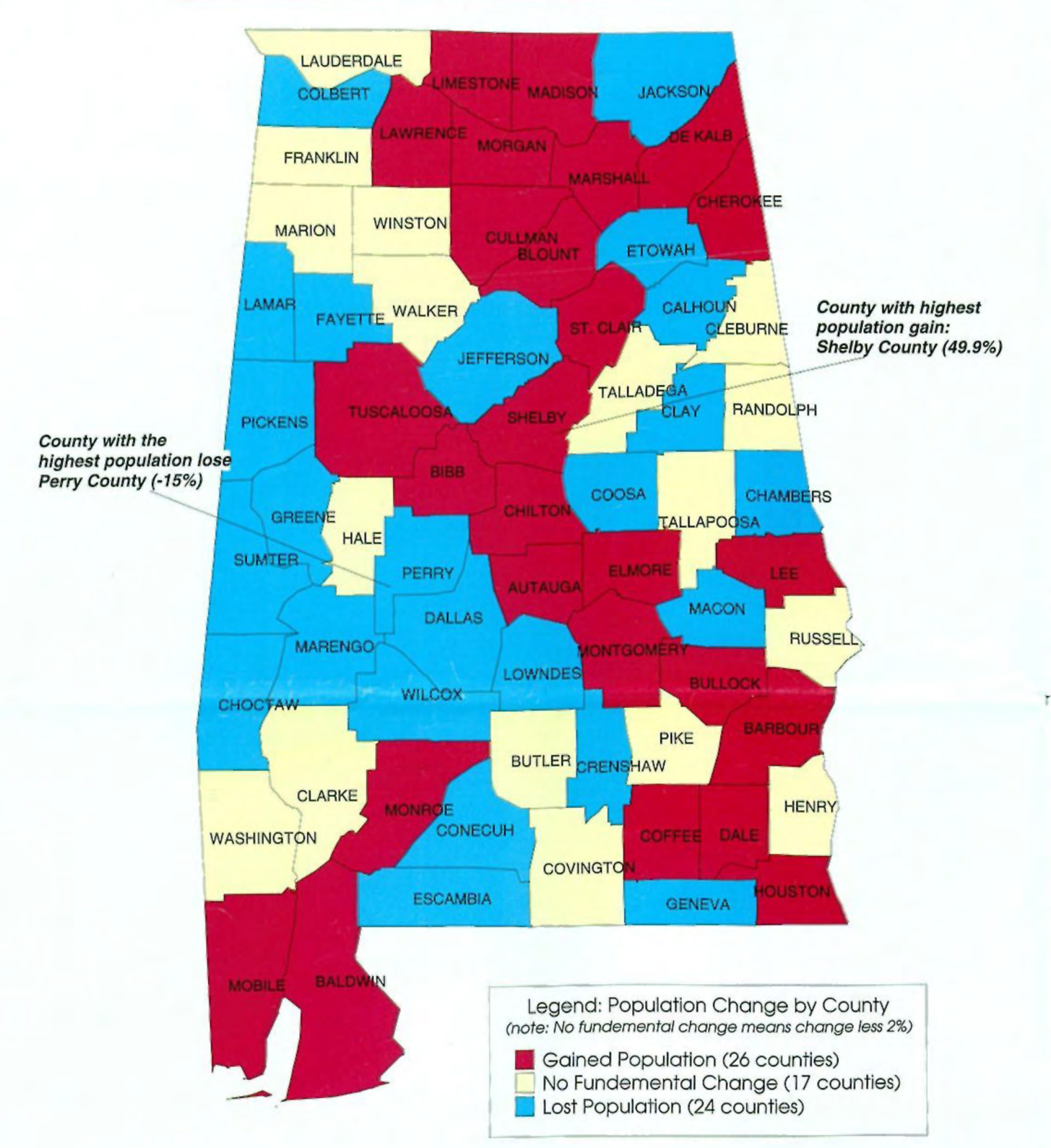

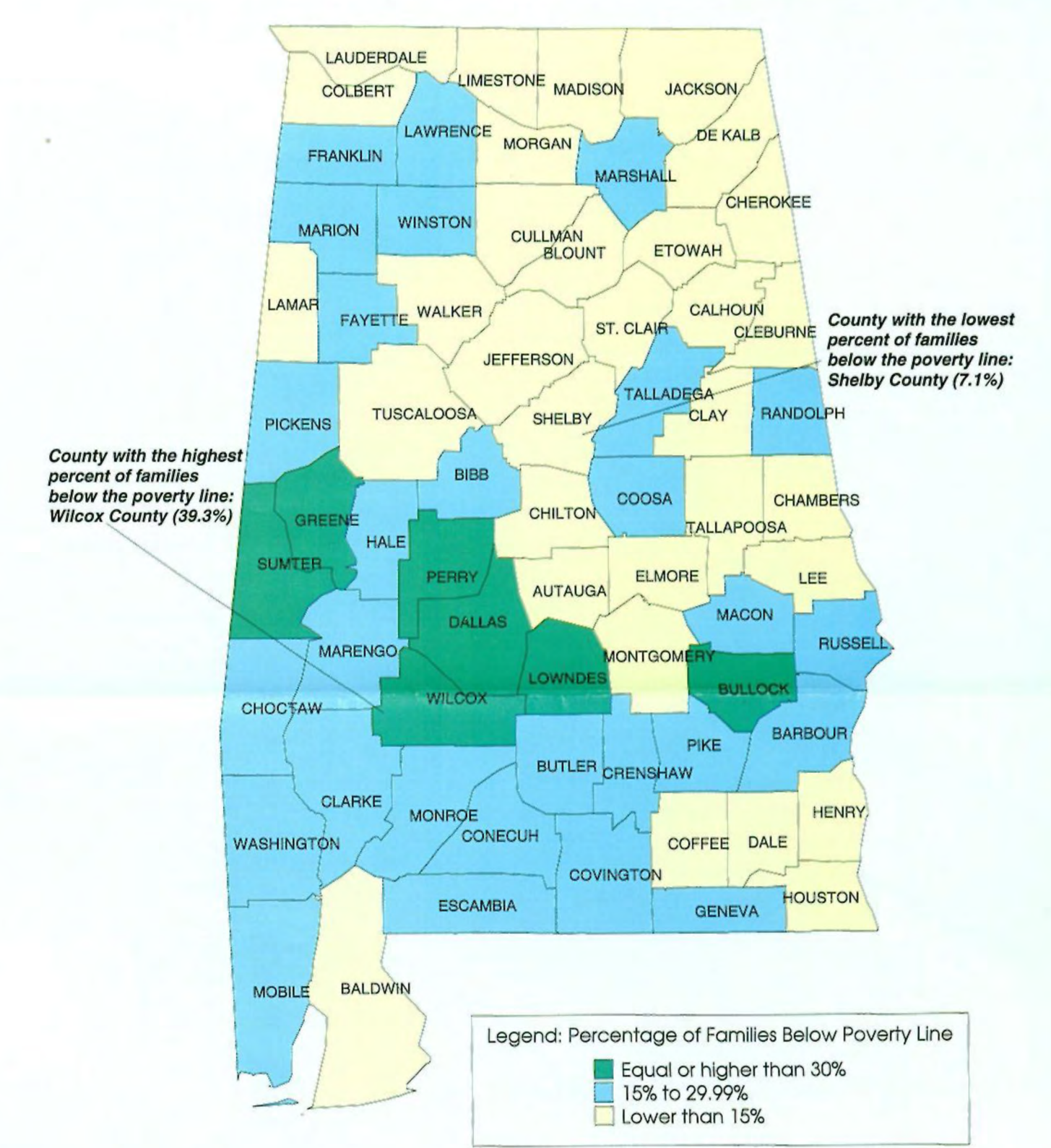
**Total Population by County, 1994**

# Alabama

## A Demographic View

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This poster presents a range of vital and functional demographic and related data on the State of Alabama. To achieve this, we have used geographic information system software, primarily MapInfo, in conjunction with TIGER files and other data sources. In selecting the data to be included in this publication, we have relied heavily on our records of the kind of information generally requested and inquiries we have received during the past few years from government and private agencies, as well as other organizations and persons across the state and beyond.
