DODCELEBRATES DR. CHARLES R. DREW (1904-1950), surgeon, teacher and researcher, pioneered work in blood plasma leading to medical discoveries that have saved countless lives. JACKIE ROBINSON (1919-1972), broke the color barrier in major league baseball in 1947 by ignoring social critics and demonstrating skill and determination. 1ST LT. VERNON J. BAKER (1927-), the last of the World War II African-American soldiers still alive who earned the Medal of Honor for valor under fire in Germany on April 5, 1945. President Clinton presented Baker's award Jan. 13, 1997. ROSA PARKS (1913-), longtime civil rights GORDON PARKS (1912-), activist who was renowned photographer, instrumental in author, composer and ending bus film director; holds 14 segregation in honorary degrees and Montgomery, many national Ala., in 1956. She awards. continues to speak out for racial equality.
