MOUNTAIN PICTURES

1. Eleanor Hutchens with her aunt's fox terrier, Span, at the old William Powers Newman place on Monte Sano, 1921. This summer place was off the east side of Monte Sano Boulevard approximately opposite Viduta Lane.

2, 3, 4, 5. Eleanor Hutchens at the Newman place, 1921. Her great-grandmother, Mrs. William Powers Newman, was still living and her grandparents, Ellen White and William Wyeth Newman, were spending the summer at the place. Note the caption "Playing in the sand." Monte Sano yards were sandy, not planted with grass. Weeds grew beyond the immediate area of the houses, as 4 & 5 show. The man with Eleanor in 4 is her grandfather, W. W. Newman (1872-1956).

6, 7, 8. Eleanor Hutchens at the old William Thomas Hutchens place on Monte Sano. The lot was at the SE corner of Monte Sano Boulevard and Nolen, the house a two-story frame facing Nolen. None of the roads were paved, of course. In these three pictures the camera faces the back of the side porch, which was on the western side of the house. We are looking toward the intersection of side and front porches.

9, 10. Eleanor Hutchens and her brother Billy (1921-1972), shown in 10 with Elizabeth Russell (Mrs. Vernon) Hutchens, at the W.T. Hutchens place. The front gate is behind them.

11. Susie Newman (Mrs. Morton) Hutchens with her four children, on the front porch of the W.T. Hutchens place. The children are Margaret (now Mrs. W.G. Henson, Huntsville), Sue (now Mrs. Charles Henson, Monroe, Ga.), Eleanor, and Billy.

12. This belongs with 6, 7, & 8. Eleanor and Mrs. Vernon Hutchens at the end of the side porch.

13. Playing on the old hotel coach, early 1930's: Ben Hughes, Everett Watkins, Mrs. Walter Wellman, Edgar Mitchell, Mrs. Jess Young, Willard Young, Billy Hutchens. The house where the Wellmans stayed in summer (Mrs. Young was a Wellman) is still on the north side of Nolen, with a long sloping tin roof.
