

Phone Conversation March 14, 1957 at 11:50 a.m. Robert K. Bell - General Shinkle

- B (To Operator) 2400, please.
- Sec. General Shinkle's office.
- B This is Robert Bell. I wonder if I might speak to the General.
- Sec. All right, just a moment, sir.
- S This is General Shinkle.
- B Good morning, sir. This is Robert Bell.
- S Yes, Mr. Bell.
- B We have run into a situation this morning that is tending to handicap us considerably in talking to some of the witnesses in behalf of Colonel Nickerson's defense.
- S Yes.
- B Colonel Bengston and Captain Ledford have called and said they would be glad to come in and let us have a conference with them, but they insist on military counsel being present when they came.
- S Yes.
- B We would like to see those two gentlemen this morning and would like to see them with just the Colonel and me talking to them.
- S Now, isn't that their election?
- B Not necessarily, because Nickerson is not required to have military counsel at all. They can have counsel of their own.
- S That's what I understood they wanted from you.

 It was my understanding of what you told me--you said both Colonel Bengston and Captain Ledford?
- B Yes.
- S They said they would like to have their own counsel there?
- B I didn't understand it that way. They told me they didn't want to talk without military counsel being present. I didn't know whether they had reference to appointed defense counsel or whom.

- I don't know, either. This is pretty much a matter of their own affair, whether to talk or not to talk and when. It is not something I can give them an order to do, one way or another. What do you propose that I do?
- B I wanted to know if they were under suggestion from higher authority to proceed in this fashion.
- S I have given them no instructions whatsoever.
- B You don't know whether General Medaris' office has or not?
- S That I do not know.
- B Thank you, General. Enjoyed talking with you.
- S Mr. Bell, I have given them no instruction whatsoever. They have an interest in this. Whether they require legal counsel or not I don't know. That is their own election; whether they got instructions from General Medaris or not I don't know. I have not given them any.
- B Thank you. We will get back in touch with them.
- S All right.
