interviewed all these wonderful

day night before she started to

staid all night at Tates and that
on Sunday she went all the way to
Sam Pools who then lived at
Armstead Jones ^{old} place with Gor
don one of the murderers & no
one else in company with her

13 Did she make any complaints
to you either then or before against
Dr. Davis or Mrs McDavid, or Abner
Tate or John Gordon or Mrs Tate -
If any tell what they were -

14 State whether you were or not much
in Mrs Howles Company in the Spring
or Summer of 1845 - How often & when
did you see her -

15 State if you know what was then
the state of her feelings towards
Mr Tate and Mrs Tate or either of
them -

16 Did you see Mrs McDavid after
the Fall of 1845 -

17 Did you hear her speak of Mrs
Howle - or the string or a piece of
flannel - If yes - tell all that
she said - relate to those matters -
If she expressed any opinion about
Mrs Howles mind tell what she said
& what answer she gave -

18 Did Mrs Howle in the Fall or Winter
of 1842 or the Spring of 1843 tell you
of her having staid all night at Abner
Tates & of her hearing the cry of murder
at the office, or of hearing any words
struck them or that she heard
Tate say god damn you about
that noise - Or that she heard
