Aiding Count Almaviva in his task of winning the heart of Rosina is a barber called Figaro.

In the transformation scene Rosina writes a love letter to Lindoro and it is delivered by Figaro because of the fact that he has access to the house and comes and goes freely.

In the second act his plan of Almaviva to elope with Rosina is broken up but this does not discourage him. Taking the place of a music teacher hat was taken ill he endeavors to make another plan with Rosina.

Finding out that Lindoro and Almaviva are both and the same person she agrees to marry him and they elope.

While all this is going on Dr. Basilio has hastened to the lawyers office to try and stop the wedding but arrives to late.

On his return he is very much disappointed but suites down finally and gives his blessing to the wedding.
